In particular, Rainer Wilton the Clubs Secretary who has implemented a volunteer and race organisation system (using Podio) and streamlined processes and procedures to the point that race directors and volunteers have complemented the club in relation to the ease with which a race is run. Kudos is also due to Rainer for his tireless work behind the scenes ensuring the committee is on track, the timing system is working properly and we have live results at each race; and that voices are listened to and opinions heard. On behalf of the club, I thank Rainer for his efforts and note that they do not go unnoticed.
		Steve Crispin is also to be applauded for his week-in, week-out commitment to the running of the summer criteriums. Many take for granted that crits will just happen each Wednesday evening, not realised the amount of time and effort that goes on behind the scenes to ensure its success. Steve is the first to arrive at the criterium track on Wedesday afternoons, and the last to leave. He does it with a smile, positivity and enthusiasm that resonates throughout the whole night. On behalf of the club, I thank Steve for his efforts and note that they do not go unnoticed.

		Tristan Dimmock (had to mention myself) - winning Gold in the Grand Fondo Time Trial 18-34 category at the Road National Championships;

		 Main Account - \$52,786.73 Term Deposit Account - \$20,413.62 (Interest Received 2020 - \$413.62)
		The Club made a small profit for 2020 of \$9,710.
		This was mainly due to \$7,000 sponsorship received for the summer criteriums. Not taking the sponsorship into account the Summer Crits had a loss of \$-1,416.
		We need to take into account that the ACT Government did not charge for use of the facility and the majority of First Aid invoices were paid in 2021.
		Road Income was \$12,531, and Expenses were \$8,515 giving us a profit of \$4,016 for the calendar year It is noted that this did not include a range of invoices for traffic control services where costs were incurred in 2020, but paid in 2021.
		Track Racing had expenses of \$2,932 with no income.
		The Club's normal running cost expense were \$8,060.
		Membership fees were down on 2019, by \$2,602.
